An Update on the Wickham Show - October 31st 2015

Costs: Costs have, not surprisingly, risen quite a bit since our last show two years ago. Once again we are not charging a fixed entry charge, simply asking for donations. Please be very *persuasive* if you are taking donations or selling raffle tickets! Please be very *generous* if you are making donations yourself!

I doubt if we will break even this year, but our group finances are very healthy (around £3,100 in credit) and I'm sure you would agree with me that to use just a small percentage of this to subsidise our shows would be applauded by our late colleague Harry Pitt. Harry died in 2005. His legacy gave us the financial confidence to run these shows.

Bring & Buy: please label all your items (or bundles of items) in advance with your asking price, give them to Adrian at the stand. He will log them and at the close of show (or when you leave) either return them to you unsold (no charge) or give you the sale money less ten per cent (which goes to group funds). Adrian has set no real limit on the number of items - but you must label them with your asking price before giving them to Adrian. (This is to avoid congestion at the stand on the day)

Raffle: some quite splendid top prizes - most generously sponsored once again by Kent Garden Rail - thanks Andy!

Local accommodation: "The Old House", The Square" Wickham (PO17 5JG www.bb-wickham.com) offers bed & breakfast at around £120 for a double room, ie £60 per person, or around £80 for a single room. A charming old style hotel, just a five minute walk from the Hall. Easy

overnight parking in The Square (I have no financial interest in The Old House!)
